

Traveling

If you have recently traveled in the U.S to any other state(s) than Massachusetts, you MUST either quarantine upon return to MA for 14 days or provide a negative COVID test within 72 hours of your return. You must also disclose this information to us upon arrival to your family visit. If you haven't quarantined, you must do so before returning to visit with your loved one. <u>Please reschedule your</u> <u>appointment accordingly.</u>

Reschedule

If you're experiencing symptoms of COVID-19 or are feeling unwell, please call and inform us. We are more than happy to reschedule your family visit when you are feeling much better.

If you must cancel please give the facility at least a 48-hour notice so

they may fill the open visit slot. All outside visits will remain in the front walkway area. All indoor visits will take place in the family room.



Who can you visit

- Residents who are suspected or confirmed to be infected with COVID-19 cannot be visited.
- Residents who are under quarantine may participate in visitation as long as safety can be maintained during transport and the visit.
- A trained staff member must be present at all times during the visit.
- The staff and resident MUST wear a surgical face mask and visitors MUST wear a face covering at all times during the visit.

Visiting Days and Hours

The **30-minute visit** will be limited to **no more than two** (2) visitors at a time over the age of 18, <u>once a week</u> in an effort to accommodate visits for all eligible residents. Our current visitation hours are:

Monday 9:30 am-1:30 pm Tuesday 9:30 am-1:30 pm Wednesday 9:30 am-1:30 pm and 3:30 pm-5:30 pm Friday 9:30 am-1:30 pm

Saturday 12:00 pm-4:00 pm

<u>Requirements</u>

- The visitor must agree to the following conditions for physical visitation inside the nursing center.
- The visitor will be required to initial the Screening Form at the paragraph that states this requirement before being allowed entry to the center.
- The visitor will sign the COVID-19 INDOOR AND OUTDOOR VISITATION ASSUMPTION OF RISK form.
- Failure to agree will result in a termination of visitation.

<u>Regulations</u>

The visitor must be screened by the facility staff for symptoms of COVID-19 PRIOR to transporting the resident to the visitation space. Screening shall include checking for fever greater than 100 degrees Fahrenheit, cough, shortness of breath, sore throat,myalgia, chills, or new onset of loss of taste or smell. A single symptom shall be indication that the visitation cannot occur.

Physical Distance: defined as 6 feet distance between the resident and visitor. Physical contact will be permitted if desired by the resident and visitor. Physical contact requirements are as follows: Use of alcoholbased hand sanitizer before and after contact, hugs with faces in opposite directions, and contact will be limited to avoid close face to face contact, even when masks are used.



If the visitor entering into the long-term care facility develops signs and symptoms of COVID-19 such as:

fever, cough, shortness of breath, sore throat, myalgia, chills or new onset loss of smell or taste within two (2) days after exiting the long-term care facility or designated outdoor visitation space, they must agree to immediately notify the long-term care facility of the date they were in the facility, identify all individuals they were in contact with, and the locations inside or outside the center they visited.
